...story continued from page 1 dedicated to appreciating the amazing architectural legacy of South Bend. Our first spotlight is the former South Bend Hose Co. 3. City records indicate South Bend Fire Station #3 was first built in 1858, with other sources listing 1887 as the first year of service. The South Bend Fire Department was run by volunteers from 1852 through 1887, a potential cause for this discrepancy. Station #3 was one of 11 fire stations in the original city network. Station #3 was decommissioned in 1953, but its recently renovated form still graces Hill Street today. If you are interested in South Bend Architecture, feel free to check out the project online.
